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INTRODUCTION

This survey is prepared for International Federations (IFs), International Organisations of Sports for the Disabled (IOSDs) and Recognised International Federations (RIFs). Its aims are threefold: 1) to encourage a healthy dialogue on Code Compliance and facilitate IPC's monitoring of Compliance in accordance with Article 13.2 of the 2015 IPC Athlete Classification Code (the Code), 2) to supplement the Los Angeles 2028 Sport Programme Questionnaire for IFs, and 3) to gather up-to-date information from each member on various areas in classification which will aid the Code review process.

We hope that completing this survey is as useful to you as it is to the IPC.

We strongly suggest that your Head of Classification (or equivalent) reviews the contents of this survey as soon as it is received. You will note that the survey is divided into sections, each consisting of multiple questions. Some of the questions require a simple numerical response (for example "How many Athletes were evaluated in each year since 1 January 2017?"). These questions are operational and if your organisation uses a Classification Database then the information may be readily available on there.

Capitalised terms in this letter have the meaning given to them in the 2015 IPC Athlete Classification Code and International Standards, unless otherwise defined in this survey.

The first four sections (particularly A.4., B.1. - B.3., and D.1. - D.4.) consist of more complex questions. We recommend that these questions are answered by your Head of Classification (or equivalent) in consultation with any relevant advisory groups or committees, as well as research or education partners. We suggest that you set aside a full day to answering these questions as they focus on the strategic and core aspects of your Classification System.


B. CLASSIFICATION RESEARCH






